Reporting of Heavy Goods Vehicles in Villages

Hampshire County Council are looking into problems associated with HGV vehicles using unsuitable routes having been directed by Satellite Navigation systems designed for cars. They would like to hear from you about any difficulties that you are experiencing with HGV's being wrongly directed by SatNav to use inappropriate roads. Flood Prevention – Hart DC have requested that if residents notice road drains that have become blocked during wet weather conditions they could clear the grid so that the surface water can flow away or, if severely blocked, alert Hampshire Highways on **0845 603 5633**, as in an emergency situation it is imperative they are informed straight away to avoid serious damage to the drains and surrounding areas.

Street Lighting Faults – faulty lights in **Crondall** should be reported to the Parish Clerk on 01256 765430 or e-mail to clerk@crondall-pc.gov.uk Faulty lights in **Ewshot** should be reported on either Tel; 0845 6035633 or directly to the Street Lighting HQ on 01962 845911. Please state the number of the faulty street light (to be found on the relevant pole or column), the nature of the fault, and the date and time you noticed the fault.

Dog Fouling on Streets – Fines up to £1000! There have been reports of anti-social incidents of dog fouling on the streets in Crondall and in particular outside of the school. The failure of owners to clear the waste results in a health hazard and is unpleasant for all residents walking through the village. Residents are reminded that such fouling of the streets is an offence under the Hart Dog Fouling Order 2001 (see extract below).

Free dog waste collection bags may be obtained from the Parish Office, Church Rooms in Croft Lane between 9.30-12.30 Monday to Friday. The Parish Office staff are kindly keeping a small supply of the bags but further supplies are available from the Hart District Council (HDC) Dog Warden department (contact details below); cheap ‘nappy sacks’ provide another alternative disposal method. The bags can be used individually, effectively as a ‘glove’, to pick the waste up or be used in conjunction with a plastic dog waste collection item available from pet shops; these make it easier and more hygienic for owners to clean up after their dogs. Used bags may be deposited in any HDC litter bin. Litter bins are located on Hook Meadow and both Football Fields in Crondall and Ewshot.

Extract from Hart District Council web site – Dog Warden section:

Hart Dog Fouling Order 2001

On 1st December 2001 new dog fouling controls came into force in the District. The controls require all dog owners to clear up after their dogs in all areas of the district, other than:

- Land used for agriculture or for woodlands
- Land which is predominately marshland, moor or heath
- Rural common land

Fines for failure to clear up after a dog can be up to **£1000**. Hart maintains a policy of prosecuting offenders where there is sufficient evidence. Registered blind people are excluded from this legislation.
